School Attendance

With some cold and wet weather setting, I was reminded of the critical importance of regular school attendance. While I'm sure this is well understood, students should be at school unless they are legitimately sick, on pre-organised leave or at a medical appointment. Absences without these reasons are considered unjustified. A day here and a day there, quickly accumulates and can have a lasting impact, including the potential for school refusal.

Could I please kindly request the SMS response system be used as the method of notification for absences. As you will know, if your child is absent an SMS will be sent mid-morning the day you child is away. A simple text response of 'sick' is all that is required to meet your and our legal obligation to register non-attendance. If you are unable to respond immediately, please remember that you have 7 days to send a response to that text, before the absence becomes unexplained.




A warm welcome to our local Pre school Visiting our Kindy classrooms

I am thrilled to share the highlights from our first debate of the year, where our Stage 3 team took on the challenging topic: "Debating should be mandatory." Representing the negative side, our team put forth a compelling argument that showcased our preparation and teamwork, earning praise from the adjudicator who remarked that we demonstrated the skills of experienced debaters despite our entire team having no previous debating experience ("Does it count if I argue with my parents all the time?" - A quote from our second speaker.)

In a very closely contested debate, we presented several key points to support our stance. We argued that making debating mandatory could detract from valuable time that could be better spent on core subjects like mathematics. Another point highlighted potential upheaval in classroom dynamics; teaching debating to all students might lead to increased arguments with teachers, disrupting the learning environment. We also raised concerns about the mental health implications for students who experience anxiety. The pressure of mandatory debating could lead to lower attendance rates and further exacerbate these issues.

Despite our strong rebuttals, the adjudicator ultimately decided in favour of the opposing team, who argued that debating is a useful life skill. Although we asserted that these skills could be developed in other contexts, our rebuttal did not quite resonate strongly enough to tip the scales in our favour.

Overall, this debate was a fantastic learning experience for our team. I am so proud of the effort and dedication shown by each member, and we look forward to applying our insights in future debates.
